Thank you very much for submitting to CHI 2000. We are very happy to tell you that your submission has been accepted for inclusion in the CHI Technical Program.

We received many more submissions than we could accommodate within the Doctoral Consortium, and had to make difficult choices and reject several submissions that were highly rated by some of their reviewers. The decisions as to which submissions to accept were made after careful review. Shortly, you will be receiving notes from the reviewers. These notes may have detailed comments on your submission that you will find useful when revising it for inclusion in the conference publications and for your presentation.

We hope that you will respond to these experts' suggestions for improvement. Feel free to contact us if you have any questions regarding your final contribution to the publications or for its presentation at the conference. Please note that the Author Kit Information you receive with this letter is also available on-line at the CHI 2000 web site.

As an accepted submission, your work will be published as a two-page summary in the CHI *Extended Abstracts*. Included in this mailing are instructions for preparing and formatting these versions of your submission.

It is the culture of the ACM/SIGCHI Conference that authors with accepted submissions are expected to register and to attend the CHI Conference and to present their materials. Advance Programs will be mailed in the beginning of January. Although your registration is *free* as an accepted doctoral consortium candidate, you must still formally register. Web-registration will also be available, so check the CHI 2000 website.
